### **Eastern Chapter Visits the Statehouse**

Twelve Chapter members travelled to Topeka on Wednesday, March 25<sup>th</sup> for our annual luncheon with the Johnson County Delegation. First, we met at Gaches Braden & Associates office with Ron Gaches' and Scott Heinder where they provided us a briefing on the Legislature's progress.

Ron updated us on the current status of SB 24, which is now known as HB 2224. This particular bill is the Board of Technical Professions Licensure cleanup bill and it is waiting to be worked on by the full house. We should be keeping a watchful eye on this bill as a small but vocal group of architects are trying to force a discussion about scope of practice and incidental practice standards. It worth noting that this small group of architects is the exception as the original bill passed last year received support from the American Institute of Architects (AIA).

Ron also updated us on KDOT/T-WORKS funding. Currently the House and Senate budgets contain the Governor's funding levels for KDOT and T-WORKS. However both budgets are in the red and need additional work before they balance. KSPE members need to remain aware and continue to stress the importance of infrastructure funding in effort to provide a safe and efficient transportation system.

After Ron's briefing, we walked from the KSPE office to the Statehouse. Ron Gaches had other responsibilities so we were joined by Scott Heidner. Unfortunately, we ran into some bad luck this year as both the Senate and House remained in session over the lunch hour. We were only able to briefly exchange dialogue with a few Legislators who were able step away for a moment and grab lunch to go. Even so, hosting this event gives us exposure for the Eastern Chapter as we continue building a name and face recognition with our Legislators.

Finally, I'm very thankful to each of you that attended this year and I strongly encourage members to take advantage of this opportunity next year.


