We will be hosting an in-person BONUS Mathcounts Chapter competition this year. Our annual MATHCOUNTS competition for the Eastern Chapter of KSPE is back! This year's bonus competition will be on **Tuesday**, **February 1**, **2022**. Like we have done pre-COVID, it will be held at the Jewish Community Center of Greater Kansas City (5801 W. 115th Street, Overland Park, KS 66211).

Our bonus competition will advance 4 to 5 teams to the state competition in addition to some advancement opportunities based on a virtual official test. We will be advancing around 20 students to the state competition from this bonus event, so your help in making this in-person event a success would be greatly appreciated.

Future City Competition Judges Needed!

The Great Plains Region of the 2021-2022 Future City Competition will be held on Saturday 1/29/2022 in Manhattan at Anthony Middle School. We are currently in need of Presentation and Q&A judges! This competition is now scheduled as a virtual event.

We are recruiting judges for the deliverables listed below:

City Essay - 58 points – Available to be judged from late December 2021/Early January 2022 to Monday 01/17/2022:

Students write a 1,500-word essay describing the unique attributes of their future city and their solution to this year's challenge: A Waste-Free Future.

City Model Slideshow - 65 points – Available to be judged from late December 2021/Early January 2022 to Monday 01/17/2021:

Students build a scale model of their city using recycled materials and including a moving part. Teams may choose to build one model or several segments. Then teams use a provided template to showcase their model via a slideshow.

City Presentation Video - 50 points – Available to be judged from Tuesday 01/18/2022 to Saturday 01/22/2022:

Students record an up-to-7-minute video presentation about their future city, discussing its features and their solution to the annual challenge.

City Q&A - 25 points – Competition held on Saturday 01/22/2022:

Students answer questions from judges (experts in engineering, technical, and city design fields) during a 10-minute live session.

2022 BRIDGE BUILDING EVENT

The Eastern Chapter's 39th Annual Model Bridge Building Contest will be held at 10:00 AM on Saturday, March 5, 2022. Students in grades 9 through 12 within the Eastern Chapter's region are eligible to compete in the Model Bridge Contest.

The contest encourages students to get involved in a challenging and fun engineering project. The students each design and construct their own model bridge made entirely of basswood sticks and glue. The model bridges are then loaded to failure to determine the bridge's structural efficiency (total mass supported divided by the mass of the bridge). The bridge with the highest structural efficiency wins. The first and second place contestants are eligible to win an expense assisted trip to compete at the 2022 International Bridge Building Contest in Pennsylvania.
